RESTORATION TAKES A STEP FORWARD ON THE RANCH

In June, the Friends of the Fiscalini Ranch Preserve (FFRP) completed construction of a purpose-built nursery to grow plants for habitat restoration on the Ranch. The 10'x24' screen house is located within the fenced Facilities yard near the East Ranch.

The nursery has space to grow 450 Monterey pine (*Pinus radiata*) or a mix of pines and

forest understory or coastal bluff plants. FFRP has been reforesting the Ranch for many years. Since 2003, the forest has expanded approximately 25% due to replanting and forest management. This new nursery will allow us to expand these efforts. Building on an understory survey conducted last year by Cal Poly graduate student Natalie Nemeth and FFRP volunteers, we will grow native forest shrubs both to diversify the forest and to act as nurse plants for newly planted Monterey pine.

Constructing the restoration nursery was possible only because of generous support from the Arthur L. & Elaine V. Johnson Foundation, Orange County Community Foundation, and Reid Fund of the Ernest Lieblich Foundation (California Community Foundation). **Tree planting dedications** will continue to provide support for the restoration program.

Do you have a Donor Advised Fund?

If you make a grant to Friends of the Fiscalini Ranch Preserve from your Donor Advised Fund (DAF) and commit to spending down half the money in your DAF by September 30, FFRP will be eligible to receive up to \$50K in matching funds through the #HalfMyDAF challenge.

There are over \$160 billion in Donor Advised Funds across the country. The

- Qualified Charitable Distribution gifts count toward satisfying the amount of money you must withdraw each year according to the IRS' required minimum distribution rules.
- The amounts distributed as a Qualified Charitable Distribution each year can be excluded from your taxable income, thereby reducing the amount of tax you must pay.

How an IRA Charitable Rollover Gift Works

- Your IRA funds will be directly transferred to Friends of the Fiscalini Ranch Preserve to help continue our important work preserving and protecting the Ranch.

#HalfMyDAF challenge aims to move that money to nonprofits by offering matching grants. If you are a DAF holder and make the commitment to spending down half of the money in your DAF by September 30, 2022, the grants you make are eligible for matches from #HalfMyDAF.

VOLUNTEER TO HELP SOME THIRSTY TREES

Saturday, July 9, 10am – Noon meeting at the Dolphin Bench

FFRP volunteers will meet July 9 to give some young Monterey pines a much-needed drink. In addition to delivering 1 to 2 gallons of water per tree, volunteers will spread wood chips to help the soil hold moisture.

Volunteers planted these saplings in the fall of 2020 and have watered them several times since then. With minimal rain in late 2021, we skipped planting last winter. While it is possible to provide supplemental water for the trees, we cannot provide them with all the water they need to get established. Next fall we will have a healthy crop of two-year-old seedlings to plant.

FFRP Volunteers are busy nearly every day. So far this year, volunteers have devoted more than 1,875 hours to the Ranch. This week a group of volunteers cleaned up Main Street from Cambria Drive all the way south to Highway 1. After July 4th, we will be helping to clean up the fireworks in Shamel Park. Sign up to volunteer: once a year or once a week, all are welcome!

DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH ON FISCALINI RANCH PRESERVE

Dateline: Any day, any trail on the Fiscalini Ranch Preserve – Dogs off leash

Walking on the Bluff Trail with his dog off leash, the man and the dog see a fawn scampering up ahead. The dog takes off after the fawn, and both dog and fawn disappear into the thick growth of bush lupine. The man calls the dog, but it takes more than a few pleas before the dog returns. At the very least, the fawn suffered a traumatic experience.

With her dog off leash, the visitor walking the Forest Loop Trail sees another visitor heading toward her with a small dog on leash. The off-leash dog sees the small dog and races toward it, barking fiercely. The owner of the small dog quickly picks up her dog and stands her ground, as the charging, barking dog approaches. The owner of the charging dog races to stop the encounter, grabbing the dog by its collar just before it reaches the other woman who is quite frightened, holding her trembling dog.

The off-leash dog runs along the Marine Terrace Trail, chasing a ball thrown by its owner,

who trails well behind. The ball lands in front of a lone woman walking the trail. The happy dog stops in front of the woman, possibly wanting her to pick up the ball and throw it. The scene, however, is not happy for the woman, who is very much afraid of dogs. The dog's owner approaches and assures her that his dog is friendly. That declaration does not soothe the woman, whose fright turns to anger. She makes known her displeasure and walks away.

These incidences are real, occur regularly, and will continue to occur until and unless visitors who bring their dogs to the Fiscalini Ranch Preserve recognize and obey the law. County Code (9.08.020) clearly states that dogs on any unincorporated public spaces must be on leash. All trails of the Fiscalini Ranch Preserve are to be shared and enjoyed by all—community members and Cambria visitors alike. Many who visit include people with seeing eye/service dogs, young children, people using canes or carrying oxygen, and people who are frightened of dogs.

For all who visit the Ranch to enjoy its beauty and bounty, dog owners must respect the rights and safety of others by having their dogs on leash. The only public space in Cambria where dogs can be off leash is at the Cambria Dog Park on Rodeo Grounds Road and adjacent to the CCSD Facilities and Resources Department. Protect your dog, yourself, other visitors, other dogs, and Ranch wildlife – Obey the Law.
